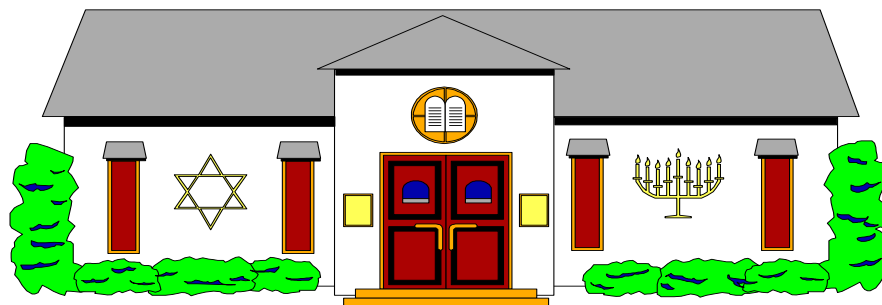

All members of the community are encouraged to attend a lecture by Dr. Avigdor Shinan, who will speak on the history and the development of the Passover Hagaddah. This lecture will be given on February 8, 1997, at 7:30 P.M. at Congregation Shaar Hashalom. Dr. Shinan is speaking under the auspices of the Horvitz Scholar-in-Residence program sponsored by the Jewish Community Center.
