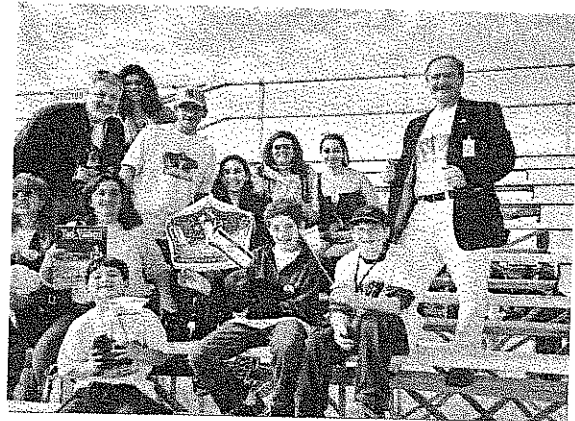

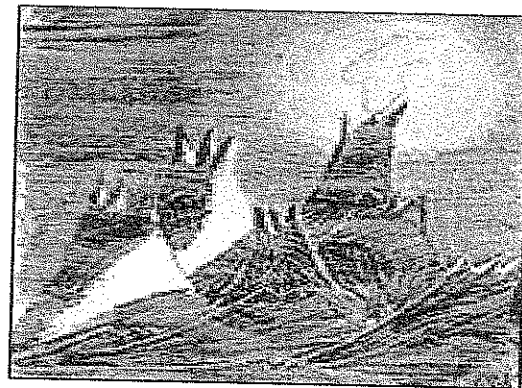

One of the items Ramon is carrying into space is a pencil drawing entitled "Moon Landscape." Created by a 14-year-old boy named Peter Ginz, it shows how Earth might look if you were on the Moon and looking back at our home world. What makes the drawing so important to Ramon is that it was created while Ginz was in a Nazi concentration camp, before the boy died in 1944.

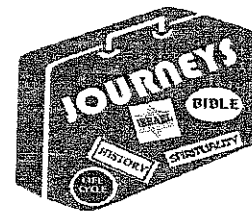

## WINDOWS UPDATE!

I want to take this opportunity to bring everyone up to date on the progress of our stained glass windows. Our committee has been working long and hard on this process and the fruits of our labor are very near. This has been a learning process for all of us on the committee.

We began almost a year ago, picking IHS Studios as the contractor to manufacture and install the stained glass windows. The process began when we supplied the artwork developed by Judy Gross and Bertha Woinsky. What followed were a number of months of reviewing graphic implementations of these designs, learning about the different types of glass available, choosing the glass colors, visiting their studio to further refine the selections and further refining the drawings to a point we felt comfortable moving on the full-scale drawings of our windows. We began the intense review of the large scale windows back in October and completed the process in December with a face-to-face with IHS to iron out any remaining questions. This culminated in our sign-off of the large scale drawings - the last step in the process prior to beginning construction. Once we had officially signed off the drawings, IHS was then able to procure the glass for our windows and fit us into their production schedule. We are anticipated construction on our windows to begin next month and are targeting installation within 1-2 months after that. Some congregants have expressed concern about the length of time this process has taken and I want to briefly address this. This has been a learning process for all of us. When we began this, no one was very knowledgeable about what it took to get from drawings all the way through to glass selection and finally drawing sign-off - believe me IT'S A LOT! The committee, and let me take a minute to remind you who we are - Boris Berezin, Pia Greenberg, Judy Gross, David Rosenfeld, Bertha Woinsky and myself, feels that the stained glass windows will be a very significant improvement to the appearance of our synagogue and enjoyed for many years to come. We want it to be perfect, so for those who are getting impatient with us - please wait a little longer - I promise it will be worth it!

Lastly, I would like to address the issue of funding the windows. As you may have heard at the congregational meeting, we have 6 of the 12 sanctuary windows funded and those are the ones that will be installed immediately. However, I want to encourage anyone who might be considering donating a window to do it sooner rather than later - if you can do it soon we might even be able to get it in with the first group. I firmly believe that once the first 6 are in and our congregants see the impact they have, the other 6 will go very quickly. A few families have approached me lately with questions about the donation amount for a window - it is \$10,000. The committee has also decided that for your donation, a plaque will be placed in the sanctuary below your window with your name and dedication on it. Even if you aren't able to fund a window yourself - consider joining with another family or families to meet the donation level. A stained glass window is a wonderful memorial or remembrance of a special event that will enhance the synagogue for lifetimes to come.
