

RABBI'S MESSAGE

A Thankful Acknowledgement

After my year-in-Israel, I did the college-student-backpacking-through-Europe thing. My favorite city in Italy remains Florence, where the Medici family, for whatever motivation, brought Jews to live and prosper.

I also remember the Medici Chapel. And I remember a conversation I had with a guard there. He commented to me how wonderful it was that the Medicis loved the Italian people so much that they would have such beautiful art created by the masters. Now, remembering that I was standing in the Medici Chapel at the time, I asked the guard, "Who were the Medicis?" He gave me a look that I richly deserved and explained that the

Medicis were the family that commissioned the incredible works of art that lay in front of me. He said that, were it not for their love of art for its own sake, were it not for their love of the people of Italy, and were it not for their love for those in whose honor they had these magnificent pieces of art commissioned, we would never have heard of the most famous of artists. Michaelangelo might never have learned to paint and to sculpt, and the world famous masters would have had to make a living doing something else besides their art.

At Slichot and at Erev Rosh HaShanah services, we recognized the Michaelangelo-work of Judith Gross as we wel-

comed her white Torah mantle into our *Aron HaKodesh*. Indeed, the brilliance of the all-white Torahs in the *Aron* was dazzling!

But I said nothing of the Medici act of Michael and Sheilla Goldberg who gave it to Shaar Hashalom. It is because of the love they have for their son, Michael, that they honor him by giving to us this work of art; and it is because of the love they have for Shaar Hashalom that we are the recipients of such a wonderful gift! This is also evident from the work Mike did around the building. He painted and fixed it up before Michael's Bar Mitzvah, as well as after, so that it would be beautiful for our Holy Days!

For that matter, we should be thankful and grateful for the Medici act of the families of Melissa and Melanie Moore for giving to Shaar HaShalom the Sefer Torah itself.

Furthermore, we should be thankful and grateful for the Medici acts of all those who serve on our Board of Directors, who give of themselves—as well as for their families for lending them to us. We should be thankful and grateful for all those who chair and serve on a congregational committee and the membership of those committees. We are so lucky to have those in our congregation that, like the Medici family, honor their loved ones and friends in a way that benefits our whole congregation!

I think that there is another lesson for us to learn in this.

So often we are only aware of the "material" in our lives and forget the "spiritual." We can appreciate the artwork but we forget the spiritual relationship that the Medicis had with art, with the Italian people, and with those in whose honor they commissioned the masterpieces.

We can admire the incredible work of Judith Gross when we see the new Torah mantle, but we forget the spiritual relationship the Goldbergs have with their son—and with the congregation—that led the Goldbergs to give the Torah mantle to Shaar Hashalom!

We can appreciate the Sefer Torah used by the Junior Congregation and for the Bar and Bat Mitzvahs, and lose sight of the spiritual relationship between Melissa and Melanie Moore and

their family, as well as the relationship between The Moores and their family with our synagogue, when they gave the Torah to Shaar Hashalom in their honor.

We can appreciate the hard work that our members put in for the sake of our synagogue community, and yet forget about the spiritual connection that is expressed through their hard work.

And we can look around us and see the material world and not remember the spiritual relationship we have with Gd, our Creator, a Gd whose love for us is expressed in making such a beautiful world. And that, too, is a lesson taught to us by the High Holy Days and Sukkot that ends about the same time that you will be receiving this edition of the Shofar.

We should be thankful for the material, but also for the spiritual—for it is the spiritual that motivates our membership to work in the interests of our congregation.

I am grateful to Gd for making such a beautiful world, for the wonderful, inspired people in it, and for the spiritual that is in all of us as well. And I wish that we had many more like them all in our congregation!

CSH Journey to Israel in 2000

Our Spring departure time is quickly approaching. You might want to start a "to-do" list that includes applying for passports or work visas, shopping for personal toiletries and medicines, purchasing comfortable clothing and shoes. Israel is chilly in the winter, and even summer evenings in many areas are cool enough to warrant a sweater. Average temperatures range from 53° to 69°F and even up to 85° towards Eilat and the Dead Sea. Necessities include a sun hat, sunscreen, sunglasses, and comfortable walking shoes. Bring a bathing suit, too. (However, when visiting religious sites, modest attire is prescribed.)

The currency of Israel is the New Israel Shekel (NIS). Each shekel is divided into 100 *agorot*. Bank notes are in denominations of 20, 50, 100, and 200 shekels, and coins in denomination of 1, 5, and 10 shekels, and 10 and 50 *agorot*. Major credit cards (American Express, Diner's Club, VISA and MasterCard) are widely accepted throughout Israel. Payment in foreign currency exempts tourists from Value Added Tax (VAT) on certain purchases and services. A favored method of payment is with a bank card. This insures proper rate of exchange. The best guides will help us explore this marvelous land of history and

tradition. When the trip is over, there will be the memories: of dusty Jericho, of floating in the Dead Sea, of prayers freely given at the Western Wall. History will come to life as you climb Masada, visit the Tomb of Rachel, find closure at Yad Vashem, drive the Golan Heights, and cross the Sea of Galilee by boat. There will be pictures of the plain where David slew Goliath; the caves where the Dead Sea scrolls were hidden, the halls of the Knesset, the streets of Tiberius, Tel Aviv and Jerusalem.
